POLITICS AND TOURISM IN THE AGE OF FASCISM BETWEEN CENTRE AND PERIPHERY

The essay considers fascist tourism policies from the viewpoint of the relationship between centre and periphery. Tourism represents a growing area for academic research. Recent reforms of local government in Italy encourage the adoption of a perspective of political history in the analysis of tourism policies, also with the aim of unearthing the roots, both positive and negative, of Italian tourism today. It also outlines how the measures undertaken by the regime in this sector were affected by both its domestic and international policies.
